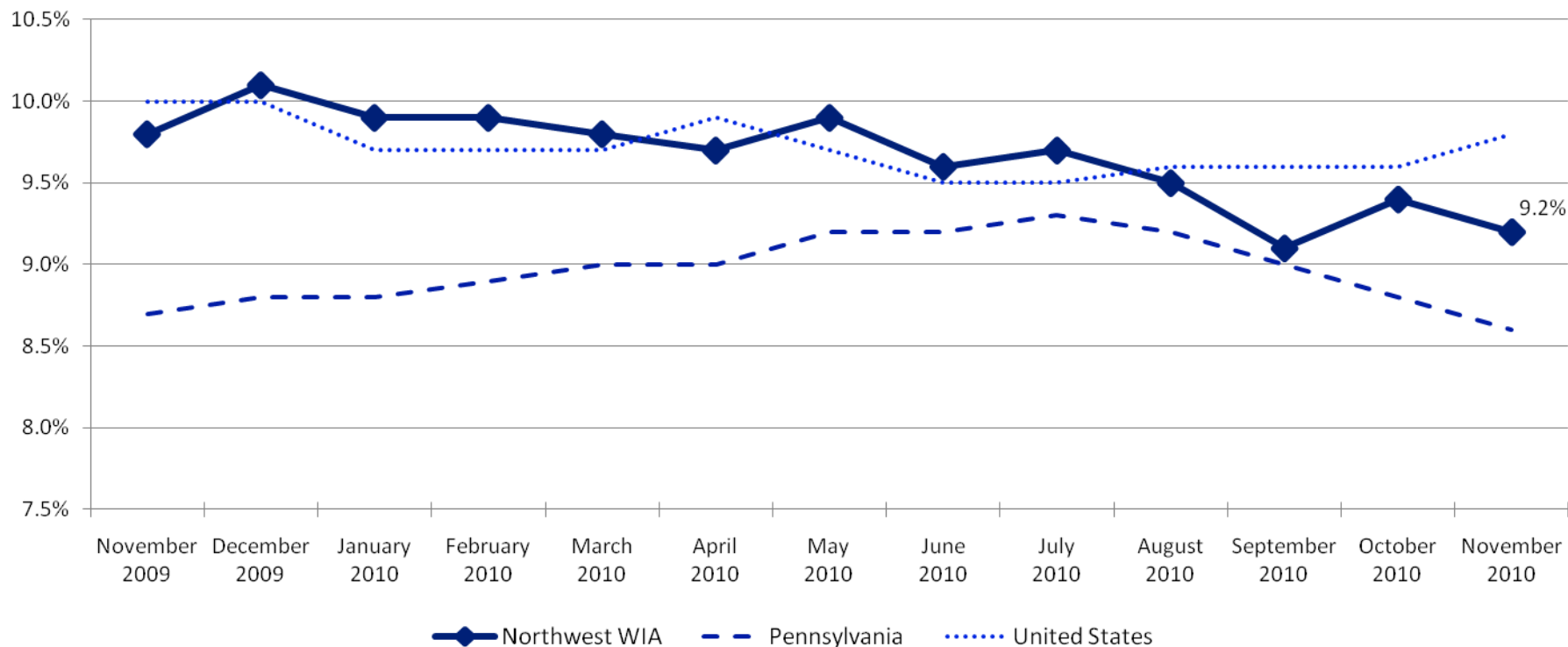

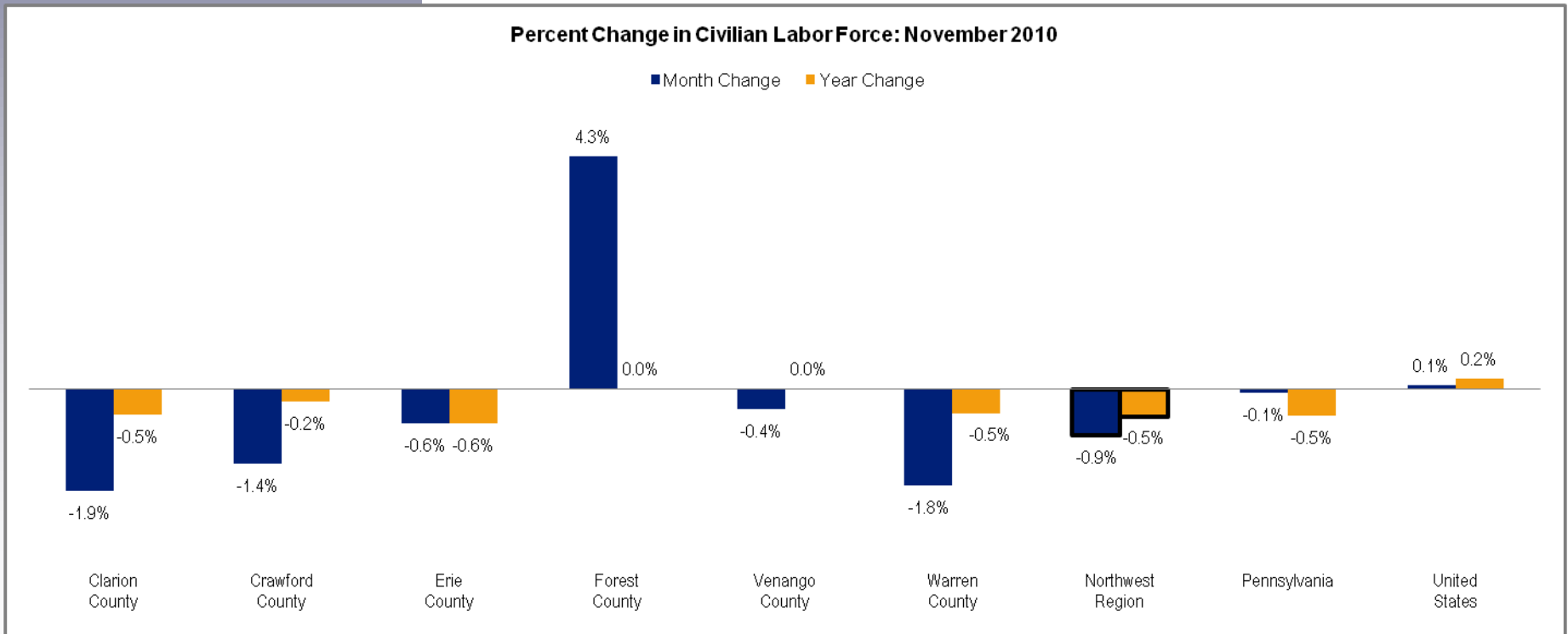


**Civilian Labor Force**

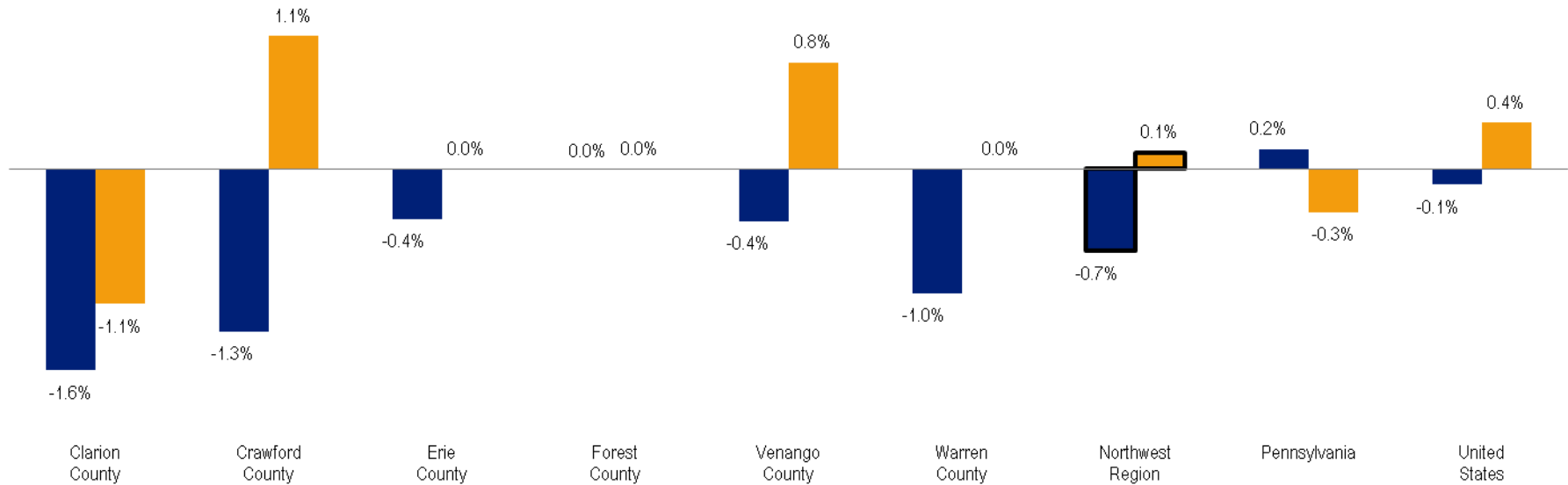

■ Month Change ■ Year Change



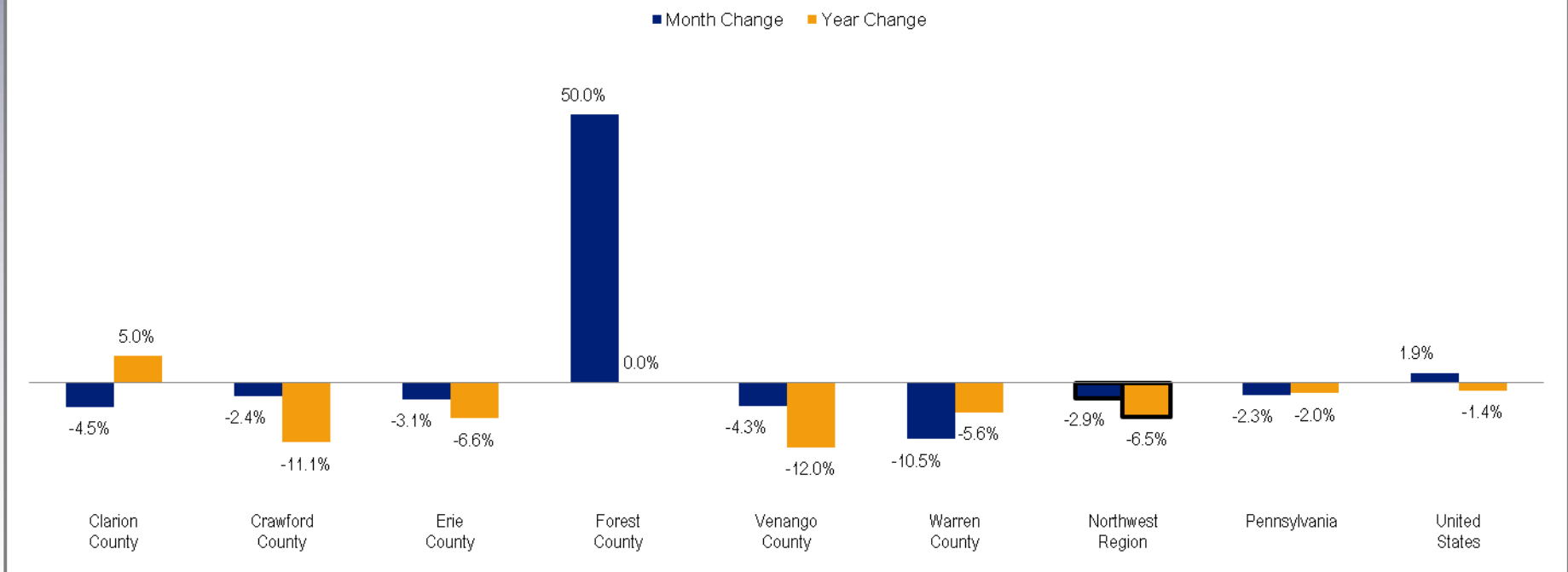
